Surgery Car Service on the road!

We are pleased to report that this service is now helping residents, who have transport difficulties, visit their Doctor. It serves both the **Meads Medical Centre** and the **Bird In Eye Surgery**. The service is run entirely by volunteers, with two coordinators and six drivers, who take it in turns to cover Monday to Friday each week.

And so if you, or someone you know, need help with transport across town to visit your Doctor, and you live on Manor Park, Hempstead Fields, or in Streatfeild House or Shaftesbury Court then you qualify for this new service - you don't have to be a member

There is a fixed charge of just £3.50 for each return journey.
