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Good Neighbour Scheme – is it needed, will it work?

The Association, in conjunction with AiRS and the Uckfield Volunteer Centre, is hoping to introduce a Good Neighbour Scheme for the residents of Manor Park and Hempstead Fields.

A Good Neighbour Scheme is a voluntary group run by local residents who recognise the value in having 'good neighbours', particularly where public transport and other local services can be limited and where people's family may not live close by. Each volunteer decides what sort of help they are able to offer, how much and when. Volunteers would not undertake jobs best left to qualified professionals but help with things like occasional lifts, befriending or shopping.

All volunteers would be fully insured and DBS checked for extra peace of mind.

Anyone who wanted a bit of extra help would ring the group's phone number and a volunteer phone-handler, would then match the request for assistance with an available volunteer.

On the opposite page you will find a survey form listing some of the services that we might be able to offer through the scheme and columns for you to tick either the **services that you might use** or where **you might be able to help**.

Please take a few minutes to complete the survey. Your replies will then help us decide whether a scheme is needed and whether it would work. Please be assured we will not share your personal details with anyone else.

The TN22 Plus Club – supporting people with dementia and their carers

Our long-term supporter Bill Hadgkiss submitted this article to tell us about the important work of the TN22 *Plus* Club. Bill has been a volunteer since it began in November 2013, and also helps out at its sister club, the TN22 Club, which provides a social and luncheon club for the over 60's.

The TN22 *Plus* Club provides fortnightly activities and companionship on a Wednesday, plus a two course freshly cooked meal for those with mild to moderate dementia.

Many older people are becoming increasingly isolated and lonely and we aim to combat that with our unique blend of fun, frolics and food.

Members of the TN22 *Plus* Club benefit from a full five hours of activities, companionship and fun - usually around a theme of the day, when they are encouraged to recall their memories with music, poetry, laughter and song playing a large part in the process. After a hearty meal, the afternoon is usually devoted to other activities, for example painting or crafts, or perhaps by enjoying a visiting entertainer.

The members' carers benefit from knowing their loved ones are being looked after in a caring, safe and welcoming environment, and gain free time to pursue their own interest for the day.

As a volunteer, there is tremendous satisfaction in helping members to enjoy their day, getting to know them, what they are happy to talk about, knowing what makes them laugh! Volunteers have regular meetings, and training sessions covering such things as basic but essential first aid. I have gained many new friends as a volunteer, and we mix socially whenever possible.

New members and volunteers are always welcome and at the present time we are particularly in need of **volunteer cooks** to plan and prepare meals on a rota basis alongside our regular team of volunteers. If you can spare one or two days a month of around five/six hours a day, please let us know. You don't need to be a Jamie Oliver or a Nigella Lawson!! Just someone who enjoys cooking tasty, hearty meals for a crowd of around 25 to 30 folk.


