There is a large amount going on within our Town at the moment including the improvements to our High Street, plans to build 1,000 new homes and the creation of a Neighbourhood Plan.

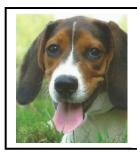

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Twelve simple steps to protect you and your home from fire

- Fit smoke alarms on each floor level in your home, keep them dust-free, and test them once a week. Consider buying a 10 year alarm; otherwise change the batteries every year.
- Make an escape plan so that everyone in your home knows how to escape in the event of a fire.
- Keep the exits from your home clear of obstructions so that people can make their escape if there is a fire. Make sure that occupants can find keys for doors and windows easily.
- Take care in the kitchen accidents while cooking account for 59% of fires in the home. Never leave young children unsupervised in the kitchen.
- Take extra care when cooking with hot oil; if you don't use one already, consider buying an electric thermostatically controlled deep fat fryer.
- Never leave lit candles unattended and ensure that they are in a secure holder on a heat-resistant surface away from flammable materials.
- 7. Ensure cigarettes are stubbed out and disposed of carefully.
- 8. Don't overload electrical sockets. One socket one plug!
- 9. Keep matches and lighters out of reach of children.
- Take special care when you are tired or when you've been drinking. Most domestic fires happen between 10pm - 8am.
- Don't leave the TV or other electrical appliances on standby as this could cause a fire. Always switch it off and unplug it when not in use.
- 12. Never smoke in bed.

Preparing a plan that sets a vision for the future of Uckfield

Green Fingers? Some gardening tips and jobs for you from now through until April

✓ **Clear up** overwinter debris from the garden. Cut back damaged wood from trees, bushes, including rose bushes. Remove last year's stalks and seed heads that you may have left for the birds. New growth should be coming through shortly.

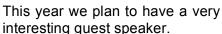
- ✓ **Daffodil and tulip bulbs etc**. After flowering deadhead immediately. Do not remove leaves until at least 6 weeks after flowering. The former stops energy from the bulb going to the seed head and the second allows photosynthesis to feed the bulb through the leaves for next year's growth, providing you with the best possible flowers for 2016.
- ✓ **Buy vegetable and flower seeds**. A polythene bag, with a few pin holes, over the container will act as a greenhouse. Place this on a sunny window sill. When seedlings are 1.5" tall, loosen the soil with a pencil. Hold each seedling by its two first leaves and gently drop its root into a pencil size hole in a 3" pot filled with compost. Growing medium for seedlings can be purchased but ordinary compost and a little good soil and grit will suffice, plus slow releasing granular fertiliser or the watering-in variety. Water as necessary and gradually acclimatise to outdoors in mid May during the day, bring in at night. Plant in beds, baskets or containers after the danger of frost has passed.
- ✓ **Plug plants** can be purchased at various stages of development if preferred. Do not plant out until late May when the danger of frost has passed.
- ✓ Brighter Uckfield Garden Competition with various classes including front garden, back garden, containers and baskets will be judged at the end of June. Application forms will be available from April onwards at The Volunteer Bureau and the Civic Centre.
