News in brief – mostly good news!

- Following a resident's suggestion and to mark the 75th anniversary of VE Day we plan to install another **commemoration bench on the brow of the hill in Browns Lane.** This will be similar in design to the bench we placed outside Streatfeild House.
- After prolonged discussions with the landlord of the shops in Browns Lane he has agreed to install a handrail to serve the steep footpath that leads to the shops.
- After two years of pressing East Sussex Highways to address the damaged and dangerously rutted grass verges in Downsview Crescent the Highways Department recently reinstated and reseeded the verge.

Sadly within a few days it was again being used at school pick up and drop off times and is rapidly being churned up and becoming a quagmire. We had asked for bollards to be installed or grasscrete laid but unfortunately these suggestions were not progressed.

We are told that the verge will be reseeded again in the Spring.

- We were sad to hear that the Sussex Horse Rescue Trust charity ha had to close Michael, Jo, Heidi and co. have been great supporters of the Association and we wish them well.
- Construction of the new Uckfield College continues and with it even greater pressure on street parking in the surrounding roads. Fortunately, our Chairman, Paul Sparks, has a good working relationship with Kevin Cowie, the Project Manager, and meets with him on a regular basis to try to iron out any particular issues. Kevin kindly came along to the AGM last summer to talk about the project.
- After a well-earned rest the Big Lunch will be back again this June please let us know if you are able to lend a hand.

Tripping?

October saw the Association's first organised day out – a minibus trip up to the Imperial War Museum in London.

We were joined by members of the Uckfield branch of the Royal British Legion and Uckfield Lions Club supplied the minibus at a knockdown rate. Lions Club member Barry drove us smoothly



and safely to and from the museum – thank you Barry.

The day was a great success and we would like to arrange a similar trip in the Spring, but first we would like your ideas. Thoughts so far include:

- The **Wings Museum and a pub lunch**. The Wings museum is just down the road near Balcombe. The museum provides "....a fascinating insight into life during WW2"
- The **Tangmere Military Aviation Museum** which is located on the former site of RAF Tangmere and includes exhibits from WW1 through to the Cold war.
- A visit to Chartwell, once the home of Winston Churchill.

These suggestions reflect that 2020 will see the 75th anniversary of VE and VJ days but we are not bound by this theme and different suggestions are welcome.

- Grants Hill Court


