Jeffreys Way – no longer such a mystery



Those of us not born and bred on Manor Park have always found Jeffreys Way a bit of a mystery! The house numbering was obviously designed by someone with a wicked sense of humour particularly the houses on the green where Jeffreys Way meets Tower Ride.

This problem was highlighted by a member at the AGM which prompted the Association to request Wealden District Council to install additional signage. This set the wheels in motion and a month or two later several shiny new signs were in place. Many thanks to Graham Kean of WDC for his help with this.



Lest We Forget Bench

To commemorate the centenary of the end of World War One and those that have died in conflicts since then, the Association has installed a 'Lest We Forget' bench seat in Southview Drive.

It was decided to install the bench adjacent to the bus stop outside Streatfeild House as this was thought to be an ideal location. It will be at the entrance to the two estates and also serve as a permanent reminder to young people of the sacrifices made by our armed forces as they walk to and from the nearby Uckfield College and Manor Primary.

It will also of course benefit our residents as they wait for a bus to take them into the town.

There was a short simple ceremony to open the bench, with Chairman Paul Sparks saying a few words and then the ribbon was cut by Georgina Gamble the mother of young Dan Gamble, 2 PARA, who lost his life on active service in Helmand Province in 2008.



None of this would have been possible without the generosity of CPJ Field Funeral Directors which made a generous donation towards the costs and

Uckfield Town Council which awarded a grant covering nearly 50% of the cost. Also, Wealden District Council kindly gave permission to place the bench on its land. A big thankyou to those organisations and to Ric Mears of Mearsy's Services for installing it for us.

Remembrance at Sussex Horse Rescue Trust



This summer the Association supported a special event at The Sussex Horse Rescue Trust.

This commemorated the fallen horses of World War One and the soldiers that cared for them - stories of courage and friendship.

Visitors were able to discover more about the war horses through living history, talks, veterinary demonstrations, interactive

craft activity and the music of the time.

This included WW1 displays and children's' activities provided by the Association such as 'paint a poppy on a pebble' and a replica WW1 Advance Dressing Station.



The Association also enlisted the support of Peter Oliver Homes which made a generous donation towards the newly established Remembrance Garden at Sussex Horse Rescue.

Other News

At the time of going to press the defibrillator at the Browns Lane shops has still not been replaced. Uckfield Lions are dealing with this, the delay is due to the insurance claim not being settled.

Repair to the verge in Downsview Crescent is still awaited too, we continue to liaise with ESCC on this.

We intend to install a Planter at the Browns Lane entrance to the estates but we are having difficulty in obtaining the recycled timber required – watch that space!


